





2018 Mid-Term Elections

- Senate
 - 35 seats
 - 26 Democrat, 9 Republican


- House of Representatives
 - All 435 seats

Important Implications of midterm elections on Capitol Hill

- Democrats need a net gain of 2 seats in the Senate and 24 House seats
- Control of the gavel
- Control of legislative agenda
- Control of committees



Legislative Activity in the 115th Congress



- Legislaiton introduced in Congress 12,266
- Referred to committee 1816
- Approved by both the House and Senate 286
- Public Law 237

Fire Service Legislative Achievements in the 115th

- AFG/SAFER/USFA Reauthorization
 - Signed into law on January 3, 2018
 - Reauthorizes USFA through FY2023
 - Contains sunset provision that would end AFG/ SAFER at the end of Fiscal Year 2024

- Fire Sprinkler Incentive Act
 - Legislation to provide economic incentives to retrofit properties with automatic fire sprinklers
 - -year effort in response to Station
 Club Fire in West Warwick, RI
 - Tax bill contained provision that allows small/medium businesses to write-off up to \$1 million for installation of sprinklers (Section 179 of Tax Code



- Firefighter Cancer Registry Act
 - Signed into law on July 9, 2018.
 - Creates a specialized national volunteer registry to help researchers and epidemiologists study cancer in the fire service.
 - Senate FY19 Labor/HHS funding measures includes
 \$1 million for the registry

Status of FY 2019 appropritions

- 12 appropriation measures to fund the federal government
 - 9 approved by Senate
 - 6 approved by House
- Homeland Security appropriations
 - Separate measures approved by the House and Senate
 - Challenge: Reaching agreement with the White House
- Strong likelihood of CR to prevent partial shutdown

- Fire Sprinkler Incentive Act
 - Fire service is working on a second provision that wasn't included in the Tax Bill: 15-year depreciation schedule and bonus depreciation for fire sprinklers and other qualified investment properties (QIPs)

- Volunteer Responder Incentive Protection Act
 - H.R. 1550 and S. 1238
 - Extends an income tax exemption on volunteer benefits that lapsed in 2010.
 - Also increases to \$600 the benefit amount that volunteers can receive tax-free in a year.


