2019 Hill Day Report

- 2019 Hill Day included over 110 meetings, 55 FAMA and FEMSA member company representatives participated and represented 42 companies located in 24 states.
- The number of meetings was close to the same number held in 2018, a major accomplishment as Congress came back into session the week of Hill day.
- Saw increased participation form both member companies and attendees.



2019 Hill Day Report

Meetings with the following key members or committees:

- 7 meetings with members of the full Senate Appropriations committee including the Chair and ranking member.
- 5 meetings with members from the Senate Homeland Security Appropriations subcommittee including the Chair, ranking member and committee staff.
- 8 meetings with members of the full House Appropriations committee including the ranking member.
- 3 meetings with the House Homeland Security Appropriations subcommittee including the ranking member and the committee staff.



2019 Hill Day Talking Points

- During the 2019 Hill Day meetings we thanked all members and staff for their continued support for:
 - AFG and SAFER and asked for an increase
 - USFA and USAR and asked for an increase
- We thanked all members for the passage of the Cancer Registry
- AFG grant appropriations increased by \$5 Million Good job!
