

Reflecting on the past 18-24 months, the world, North America, and our industry has persevered through a pandemic that triggered a host of unprecedented obstacles that, even as I write this, continue to present challenges for our organization, businesses, customers, suppliers, and partners. Like many of the challenges faced throughout the last 75 years, FAMA adapted to the environment and found effective mechanisms to deliver value to our membership, the industry, and stakeholders.

The FAMA Virtual Spring Meeting, held on April 14, delivered exciting and informative content to our members that included updates from five committees (Statistics, Technical, GAC, Meeting Planning, Education-Surveys). A big thank you to the Committee Chairs that presented. We were also treated to an always entertaining presentation by the Sage Policy Group's Dr. Anirban Basu. Dr. Basu acknowledged the challenges the industry faced in 2020, calling it a "lousy year" with booked units lagging the previous year by 12%, but was optimistic about the future of the industry citing three reasons:



- The economy has improved faster than expected.
- State governments did not experience the magnitude of revenue loss that was predicted.
- 3. The continued injection of federal stimulus, including a potential infrastructure package.

Dr. Basu also highlighted that construction spending related to fire and rescue in 2020 was at a record level of \$2.65 billion, 7% higher than the previous peak. All reasons to be optimistic!

The Q4 2020 FAMA Public Statistics Report confirms this optimism, indicating, "total apparatus sales in the fourth quarter rose 6% from the rolling pre-pandemic Nine Quarter Average (NQA)."

The FAMA/FEMSA Government Affairs committee also pivoted due to the pandemic and organized a Virtual

Hill Day. As a participant in the event, I can attest it was well organized, well attended, and a remarkably effective forum for delivering the core messages underpinning the need for funding the Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG). Again, a huge thank you to the GAC for ensuring our collective voices were heard on Capitol Hill. Mark your calendar now for Hill Day 2022 on April 6-7. Across the organization, important work continues." The Technical Committee remains steadfast in their efforts to provide valuable input into the NFPA standards revision process (1900, 1910 and 1585). The Technical Committee and FAMA Board made improvements to the FAMA Forum article process, expanding the number of contributing authors (be sure to read the latest article!). And, of course, joint planning continues in preparation for the FEMSA/FAMA Annual/Fall Conference, to be held in Tampa, FL September 21-24. Hope to see you all there!

First Virtual Hill Day a Success

One of the long-lasting changes brought about by COVID 19 is the opportunity to conduct meetings via Zoom. The 2021

FAMA/FEMSA GAC Hill Day was no exception. During the week of May 18th, over 60 virtual meetings were held with key members of Congress, their lead staff, and committee appropriations staffers responsible for developing legislation to determine funding levels for FAMA/FEMSA priority programs.

The GAC Chairs and the Presidents of both FAMA and FEMSA met with key staff from the offices of Rep. Rosa De Lauro (CT), chair of the House Appropriations Committee; Senator Patrick Murphy (CT), chair of the Senate Appropriations Homeland Security Subcommittee; Senator Richard Shelby (AL), ranking member of the Senator Appropriations Committee; and Shelley Moore Captio, ranking member of the Senate Appropriations Homeland Security Subcommittee.

The efforts, as usual, were productive. FAMA/FEMSA members presented the congressional offices with reports on how their states and/or congressional districts benefited from the Assistance to Fire Grants (AFG) program, listing

every grant received over the last four years. In addition, the offices received the updated "10 Key Facts of the Fire Service" along with the FAMA/FEMSA jobs map showing aggregate employment levels, by state, of the fire industry. It all added up to a comprehensive briefing for the offices.

Over years the Hill Days have worked. As of this writing, the House Appropriations Homeland Security subcommittee has marked up its FY 2022 appropriations bill, providing \$370 million each for AFG and SAFER. This is a \$20 million increase for the combined programs, double the annual increase of the last several years.

While the Fire Service Coalition has asked for full authorized funding of the AFG and SAFER programs (\$750 million each), it is an encouraging sign that Congress has started the legislative process with a larger funding level. The GAC will keep FAMA and FEMSA members informed as the legislation unfolds over the summer.

In the meantime, it is very important that FAMA and FEMSA members continue to push for full funding levels as you meet with your congressional



offices over the summer and fall. We encourage you conduct Home Days by reaching out to the district offices of your congressional delegations and establishing relationships with them. The updated 2021 Home Day Toolkit is now available on the GAC website, and includes easy to follow resource materials to make your events highly successful (https://famafemsagac.org/home-day/homeday-resources/). Please take the opportunity to pass them along, virtually or over a cup of coffee.

Next year we hope to reconvene in Washington, D.C. to resume our "in person" Hill Days, but what we have learned during the last year, is that we can continually keep in touch with congressional offices throughout the year. We hope you take advantage of this new capability.

Virtual or in person, the FAMA / FEMSA GAC Hill and Home Days remain key to our efforts to secure more funding and support for the Fire Service.

16th Annual Illinois Fire Service Home Day a Huge Success

The 16th Annual Illinois Fire Service Home Day was held Thursday, June 3rd at the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) Readiness Center in Wheeling, IL.

Nearly 150 attendees turned out for the event including fire chiefs from roughly 50 different Illinois departments, Congressional staffers from 11 offices and staffers from Senator Durbin's and Senator Duckworth's offices as well as 45 representatives from 10 FAMA and FEMSA member companies.

The event was a huge success in advancing issues important to the fire service and all attendees were delighted

to be in a mask free post-pandemic environment.

The following FAMA and FEMSA member companies participated: Air One Equipment, C.E. Niehoff, Darley, Dinges Fire Company, HAAS Alert, Hendrickson, Municipal Emergency Services, Paratech, RealWheels and Telma Retarder.

Speakers included Chief Rich Mikel, 2nd Vice President of the Illinois Fire Chiefs Association, Vikki Hanson, FEMA Fire Program Specialist, Glenn Ericksen, CEO of MABAS and James (JP) Moore from the Illinois Fire Service Institute.

Key Messages for FAMA/FEMSA 2021

THE AFG PROGRAM

- The Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) equipment program is one of the most effective and efficiently run programs in the Federal Government. Essentially, all funding goes to local fire departments, both career and volunteer. The selection process includes peer review.
- The AFG program fills critical equipment gaps for the over 1.1 million first responders who serve as the backbone of our nation's response capability for natural disasters and terrorist events. For example:
 - » 50% of all fire departments lack enough portable radios to equip all responders on a shift.
 - » 53% of all fire departments cannot equip all firefighters on a shift with self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).
 - » 72% of all fire departments have at least one piece of personal protective clothing that is 10 years old.

HISTORIC FUNDING OF AFG

- In FY 2021, Congress funded the AFG program at \$360 million, down 36% from its FY 2009 level of \$565 million and 11% from its FY 2011 level of \$405 million. These are significant cuts.
- We thank Congress for acknowledging this shortfall by modestly increasing the AFG program by \$5 million for FY 2021 (in addition to \$5 million for SAFER).
- We also thank Congress for providing \$100 million in AFG funding provided through the CARES Act and \$100 million in the American Rescue Plan (in addition to \$200 million for SAFER) to combat COVID-19.
- These acts of Congress are much appreciated, but more needs to be done.

JUSTIFICATION FOR THE AFG AND FIRE GRANT PROGRAMS

 First responder calls continue to be in the millions. In 2019, the fire and rescue service responded

- to 37.3 million calls, up from 36.7 million in 2018. Calls are likely to increase as the population ages and the demands of our emergency services increase from future disasters.
- By funding the AFG program, Congress supports our first responders as they meet increasing security and rescue needs. This is particularly important given the outbreak of the COVID-19 Pandemic, combined with the recent increase in the frequency, severity, and cost of natural disasters — hurricanes, tornadoes, floods and wildfires.
- As America's first responders combat the COVID-19 Pandemic, they face tremendous personal health risk while their departments are threatened by fiscal pressures, furloughs, and layoffs.
- This comes at a time when they are needed most for COVID-19 response, along with the increasing intensity of storms and natural disaster continues to grow.



Paul Darley, Co-Chairman of the event, served as the emcee. He addressed the congressional staffers, saying, "This day is about you, and we ask that you carry home the following messages: Thank you for your reauthorization of the AFG & SAFER programs. We need your



continued support and ask that congress continue increases. Last, please join the Congressional Fire Services Caucus."

Video messages were featured from Congressman Krishnamoorthi, who recently joined the Congressional Fire Caucus, and Congressman Quigley.

After 90 minutes of formal presentations, staffers had the opportunity to operate rescue tools and other firefighting equipment, as well as tour the 25,000 sq. ft. facility that houses specialized fire and rescue equipment.

Plans already are underway for next year's 17th Annual Illinois Fire Service Home Day on Thursday, June 2, 2022!



- In 2020 alone, there were 22 disasters in the U.S. that cost over \$1 billion in damage. Together these disasters cost \$95 billion total.
- To put this in perspective, between 1980 and 1989, there was an average of 2.9 disasters in the U.S. that cost over \$1 billion per year. The average cost of these disasters per year was \$17.9 billion.
- Compared to 2020, these numbers reflect an over 658% increase in frequency of billiondollar disasters and an over 430% increase in annual cost.
- The frequency and cost of these large-scale disasters is expected to rise dramatically in the coming years, and it will be the responsibility of our nation's fire service to respond.
- As our first responders continue to fulfil their role to

locally execute the nation's response to COVID-19 and other disasters, it is critical that AFG funding is expanded to support them in meeting the nation's emergencies.

THE ASK: SUGGESTED FUNDING LEVELS FOR FY 2022

- In FY 2022, FAMA and FEMSA recommend funding the AFG and SAFER programs at full authorization levels of \$750 million each \$750 million for AFG and \$750 million for SAFER.
- The U.S. Fire Administration should be funded in FY 2022 at the full authorization level of \$76.5 million. USFA supports critical training for first responders key to maintaining a cutting edge force nationally.

We also are calling for
 The Urban Search and Rescue
 Response System (USAR) to
 be funded at no less than
 \$50 million in FY 2022 (from
 \$37.8 million in FY 2021).
 The nation depends on USAR
 for its disaster response by
 sending specialized response
 units, based locally, to disasters
 across the country.

CONCLUSION:

We thank you for funding the AFG and SAFER programs in the past. We ask that you restore the funding of these programs at \$750 million each for FY 2022.

Your support is much appreciated.

Report from the Congressional Fire Services Institute

Unfortunately, the Congressional Fire Services Institute (CFSI) was unable to host the annual National Fire and Emergency

Services Symposium and Dinner program in-person for a second consecutive year. It was frustrating for us because the event is our major fundraising program and provides a rare opportunity for representatives of national fire service organizations, fire industry leaders, and federal officials to engage in discussions about important fire service issues.

Who is to say how the pandemic will impact future travel to programs such as our own? Will the benefits of Zoom meetings outweigh the benefits of direct social interaction that we derive by attending trade shows and conferences? I would be quite content if I did not have to participate in another Zoom meeting. But unfortunately, with the pandemic still posing a threat – although a milder threat due the availability of vaccination – we have a way to go before resuming our pre-pandemic way of life.

In the meantime, I have circled September 22-24 on my calendar, the dates for the annual FAMA/FEMA joint conference. I look forward to reconnecting with friends from the fire service industry and discussing how the pandemic has impacted their businesses. Once again, I have been given the opportunity to share the podium with Dave Gatton and John Granby to discuss the work of the FAMA/FEMSA GAC and CFSI on Capitol Hill.

Despite congressional offices remaining closed to visitors, including lobbyists, representatives of the national fire service organizations continue to engage in discussions with members of Congress and their staff on fire service issues. We are requesting full funding for the United States Fire Administration, as well as both the AFG and SAFER grant programs. The pandemic has only added more burdens to the work already being performed every day by our nation's fire and EMS personnel and additional funding can help fire departments and EMS agencies continue to meet the demand for services.

We are also focused on infrastructure issues that affect the fire and emergency services, including the need for up-to-date facilities.

Both FAMA and FEMSA play a critical role in our work on Capitol Hill. We often cite the data provided by your two organizations in letters and in meetings with congressional staff. What is the average cost of a self-contained breathing apparatus? How much for an engine and truck? How have the AFG and SAFER grant programs benefited the industry and local economies? This type of data bolsters our message and resonates with members of Congress.

Let us hope for a resumption of our conferences and trade shows soon. My hope is to spend three days in September with members of FAMA and FEMSA to discuss how we can continue to work together in Washington, DC to strengthen our nation's fire and emergency services.
