- **Resources:** books, publications, websites, prof. associations



## Allocations: American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) - PPE Potential

- ▶ WHAT is eligible: COVID-19 response, mitigation, and prevention activities
  - Main categories: Public Health, Negative Economic Impacts, Services to Disproportionately Impacted Communities, Premium Pay, Infrastructure: Water/Sewer/Stormwater/Broadband, & Revenue Replacement
    - ▶ Public Health: Vaccination programs, medical care, testing, contact tracing, support for access to healthcare, public health surveillance, enforcement of public health orders, public communication, enhancement to healthcare capacity, <u>purchases of personal protective equipment</u>, enhancement of data systems, payroll expenses, other public health responses, and <u>capital investments in public facilities to meet pandemic operational needs</u>.
    - Revenue Replacement the "catch all" that the US Treasury is now using (provides more flexibility.
  - ▶ Must have Evidence-Based Intervention: can support causal conclusions

### PPE, Equipment & Vehicles - FEMA AFG

- Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG)
  - Eligible applicants: fire departments, state fire training academies, and nonaffiliated EMS organizations
  - Eligible Activities:
    - 1. Operations and Safety
    - 2. Vehicle Acquisition
    - 3. Regional Projects

#### Priorities:

- Training, equipment, personal protective equipment (PPE) gear, firefighter wellness and fitness, modifications to fire stations and facilities, and firefighter vehicle acquisition.
- Nonaffiliated EMS organization priorities include EMS operations and safety, EMS training, EMS equipment acquisition, EMS PPE, EMS wellness and fitness, modifications to EMS stations and facilities, and EMS vehicle acquisition.

Must have's: FEMA GO; UEI; SAM; AOR



#### PPE, Equipment & Vehicles - FEMA AFG

- Know the likelihood going in:
  - Career, Combo, Volunteer: 25% each (total of 75%).
  - Nonaffiliated EMS Organizations: 2%
  - ► EMS services provided by fire departments & non-affiliated EMS organization: 3.5%
  - ► <u>State Fire Training Academy</u>: 3% collectively (not more than \$500,000 per SFTA applicant)
  - ► <u>Vehicles</u>: 25% (of that amount, FEMA intends to allocate 10% of the total vehicle funds for ambulances).
  - ► Micro Grants (apps less than \$50k): 25%



#### PPE, Equipment & Vehicles - FEMA AFG

- Review the NOFO!! Know the Criteria!!
  - FEMA evaluates each application on its merit, veracity, and accuracy to ascertain how the narrative statement(s) outlined within the application depicts the applicant's and their community's uniqueness, their particular risks, and how selecting them over a similarly situated applicant advances the objectives of the AFG Program to provide critically needed resources that equip and train emergency personnel to recognized standards, enhance operational efficiencies, foster interoperability, and support community resilience.

Reads NOFO the REP carefully

Still unclear of the guidelines



#### PPE, Equipment & Vehicles - FEMA AFG

- Start your Environmental Planning and Historic Preservation (EHP)
  Screening Form EARLY!!!!
- Recipients and sub-recipients proposing projects that have the potential to impact the environment, including, but not limited to, the construction of communication towers, modification or renovation of existing buildings, structures, and facilities, or new construction including replacement of facilities, must participate in the FEMA EHP review process.
- ► It is an 8-page long questionnaire with questions that demand both data and narrative answers AND you must attach photo exhibits!

#### PPE, Equipment & Vehicles - FEMA AFG

- Review the NOFO!! Be aware of the changes from last year
  - FEMA typically includes an Appendix A entitled "Program Updates"
  - **FFY22:** 
    - Under Equipment Activity:
    - ▶ P-25 compliant Portable Radios should be requested based on the number of seated riding positions or active members of the department and supported in the request narratives.
    - ▶ Repairs and upgrades to the existing simulators was added as High priority item for SFTA applicants.
    - ➤ SoftwareandLearningManagementSystem(LMS)forFireDepartmentapplicants was changed to Low priority.
    - ▶ Vehicle mounted exhaust systems are High priority for Fire Department, Regional, nonaffiliated EMS, and SFTA applicants.
    - ▶ Subscriptions necessary for the operation of the awarded equipment and purchased concurrently are eligible.
    - ▶ Refurbished equipment was added under ineligible Equipment Activity.

#### FEMA AFG - Vehicles

Not more than 25% of available grant funds may be used by recipients for the purchase of vehicles. Of that amount, based on stakeholder recommendations, FEMA intends to allocate 10% of the total vehicle funds for ambulances.

Must be 1991 or earlier

Front-Line vs. Reserve

<u>Penalty Clause Now Required in Apparatus Purchase Agreements</u>: no less than \$100 fine per day

<u>Down Payment</u>: up to 25% of the federal share to be drawn for this purpose

<u>Disposal</u>: A recipient who certifies it will remove an unsafe vehicle from service but then sells/transfers the unsafe vehicle, is in VIOLATION of grant agreement

Priority	Purpose of Request	Definition		
H	Obtain equipment to achieve minimum operational and deployment standards for existing missions	Applies to requests for equipment needed, and not currently owned, to achieve minimum operational and deployment standards for a department's existing mission requirements. This includes equipment that is no longer usable because it is broken and/or damaged beyond repair.		
H	Replace noncompliant equipment to current standard	Applies to equipment that is deemed obsolete and/or is out of compliance with current standards for that type of equipment. Equipment requested under this reason for purchase has not been deemed inoperable, and while it may not be compliant with current standards it is not broken, damaged, or otherwise unusable.		
M	Obtain equipment for new mission	Applies to requests for equipment, supplies, or inventories that are intended to fulfill minimum service requirements associated with new missions that a department is taking on and building the capability for but has not been previously fulfilled. For example, this may include, but is not limited to, establishing a new HazMat capability or Swift Water Rescue capability.		
	Upgrade technology to current standard	Applies to requests for equipment that may or may not be owned, but newer technology is available.		

#### Eligible Equipment Activities for Fire Department, Nonaffiliated EMS, Regional, and SFTA include but are not limited to:

- Shipping, taxes, assembly, and installation of the requested equipment
- Extended warranties and service agreements if acquired concurrent with initial acquisition
- Minor interior alterations (requested under Additional Funding and limited to \$10,000 total expenditure) to support the awarded Equipment activities (e.g., removal/construction of a non-weight bearing wall)
- Equipment for response to incidents involving CBRNE/WMD

- Training specific to the requested equipment
- Requested support activities for equipment requiring supplies or expendables or "onetime" use items essential for an award's scope of work, such as foam, breaching materials (e.g., wood or sheetrock) for ventilation or rescue props, or the amount of fuel required to sustain an awarded live fire training activity, or per NFPA 1403 Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions, reasonable safety mitigations to a structure acquired for training
- Subscriptions necessary for the operation of the awarded equipment and purchased concurrently within the POP

#### Ineligible Equipment Activities Fire Department, Nonaffiliated EMS, Regional, and SFTA include but are not limited to:

- Construction of facilities, such as buildings, towers, or sheds to house communications
- All fixed non-mobile repeaters or fixed site amplifiers
- Sirens or other outdoor warning devices
- Signage of any kind
- Phones (telephone/satellite/cell)
- Investments in emergency communications systems and equipment must meet applicable SAFECOM Guidance
- Personal Safety/Rescue Bailout System (PPE)
- Computer assisted dispatch (CAD) systems and software, geographic information systems (GIS), dispatch consoles, workstations and office furniture
- Nonaffiliated EMS expendable supplies (including but not limited to medications)

- Utility Vehicles and All-Terrain Vehicles (UTV/ATV)
- UAVs and Drones
- Bomb disposal equipment and robots
- Mobile radios for personally owned vehicles (except Chief Fire Officer's personal vehicle if justified)
- Supplies or expendables or common one-time use items such as foam, soaps, disinfectant wipes, medical gowns/gloves, bandages, any drug, intravenous bags/fluids, defibrillator pads/electrodes, syringes, cervical collars, batteries, exhaust system filters and splints
- Flashover or other simulators/props that do not meet NFPA 1402 or 1403 standard (homemade or aftermarket simulators)
- Subscriptions, memberships, equipment rental or lease to purchase
- Refurbished equipment

### FEMA AFG Ineligibles

#### Additional Considerations for Fire Department, Nonaffiliated EMS, Regional, and SFTA Equipment Priorities

- Equipment that has a direct effect on firefighters' health and safety
- Age of equipment considered for replacement
- Equipment that operationally benefits other jurisdictions
- Equipment that brings the department into compliance with a national recommended standard, (e.g., NFPA or statutory compliance like OSHA)

► CL/Executive summary

Organization background







  - ► Explanation of other funding sources (500 character limit)
  - ► How department is facing a new risk/challenge (3,000 character limit)
  - ▶ Describe your organization and community (4,000 character limit)
- 3 Long Narrative Sections (all are 4,000 character limit)
  - ► Project Description & Budget
  - ► Cost Benefit
  - Statement of Effect on Operations

### FEMA AFG Narrative - Long (4,000s)

- 1. Project Description and Budget: Clearly explain the organization's project objectives and the relationship to your organization's budget (e.g., personnel, equipment, contracts, etc.) and risk analysis by providing statistics to justify the needs. Describe the various activities to be implemented, including program priorities or facility modifications, to include details on how these are consistent with project objectives, your organization's mission and national, state, and/or local requirements. Provide details that link the proposed expenses to operations and safety, as well as to the completion of the project's goals.
- 2. Cost Benefit: Describe how you plan to address the operations and personal safety needs of your organization, including cost effectiveness and sharing assets. The Operations and Safety Cost Benefit statement should also include details about gaining the maximum benefits from grant funding by citing reasonable or required costs, such as specific overhead and administrative costs. The request should also be consistent with your organization's mission and identify how funding will benefit your organization and affected personnel.

### FEMA AFG Narrative - Questions

3. **Statement of Effect on Operations:** Explain how this funding request will enhance the organization's overall effectiveness. Describe how the grant award will improve daily operations and reduce the organization's risk(s) including how frequently the requested item(s) will be used and in what capacity. Indicate how the requested item(s) will help the community and increase the organization's ability to save additional lives and property. Jurisdictions that demonstrate their commitment and proactive posture to reducing fire risk, by explaining their code enforcement (to include Wildland Urban Interface code enforcement) and mitigation strategies (including whether or not the jurisdiction has a FEMA-approved mitigation strategy) may receive stronger consideration under this criterion.



- How to develop your grant budget
  - Personnel

- ► In-Kind/Match

  - Insurance

Know what type of match is required and if the grant is in advance or reimbursement-based

A well-prepared budget JUSTIFIES all expenses and is CONSISTENT with the proposal narrative. Expenses must be REASONABLE.



### **Grants: Nuts and Bolts**

- Know the Rules beforehand, during and after!!!
  - ► Uniform Guidance (2 C.F.R. Part 200):
    - Establishes uniform administrative requirements, cost principles, and audit requirements for Federal awards to non-Federal entities.
- Double-check it is UL listed
- State contracts and national consortiums


